
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ACEA Retirement Seminar

- October 2 Nomination forms available on our website at www.aceamsea.org and through MSEA's website at marylandeducators.org.
- November 13 - NEC presents report of nominees received to date to the RA, and accept nominations from the floor.
- **November 17** nominations due to the NEC committee in the ACEA office or postmarked by 5:00 p.m.
- **December 4** NEC Committee meets to review nominations and prepares notifications to nominees to submit bios and photos to MSEA for publication, as well as for *The ACEA Advocate*, and invites each nominee to address the January 8, 2024, ACEA RA. In addition, the NEC will prepare the ballot in accordance with MSEA instructions.
- **December 15** Deadline for nominees to submit bios and photos to MSEA and ACEA for publication.
- **January 2024** Publish list and/or biographical information of nominees in the January Newsletter.
- **January 8** NEC presents the final report of nominees received to the RA; nominees are invited to address the members of the ACEA RA.
- January 12 Deadline for ALL candidate bios and photos to be posted on MSEA
 website. Final spreadsheet for both MSEA and local affiliates must be provided for
 submission to the election services vendor with all information, including candidate bios.
- **January 29 -February 16** Electronic voting window. Voting will take place from 9:00 a.m. on January 29, 2024, through 5:00 p.m. on February 16, 2024, when voting closes.
- **February 21** The MSEA NEC meets to verify election results and notify ACEA.
- March 11 The ACEA NEC reports the results of the election to the RA.
- **April** The results are shared with the membership through email, newsletter and/or the website.
